

To add 26 to 48, we can add 2...
...then 24 more.

$$48 + 26 = 48 + 2 + 24 = 50 + 24 = 74$$

Adding 2 to 48 gets us to 50, and 50+24 is easier than 48+26.

$50 + 24 = 74$

That makes sense.

On the number line, adding 2 then 24 is the same as adding 26.

I didn't think about the number line.

$$48 \xrightarrow{+2} 50 \xrightarrow{+24} 74$$

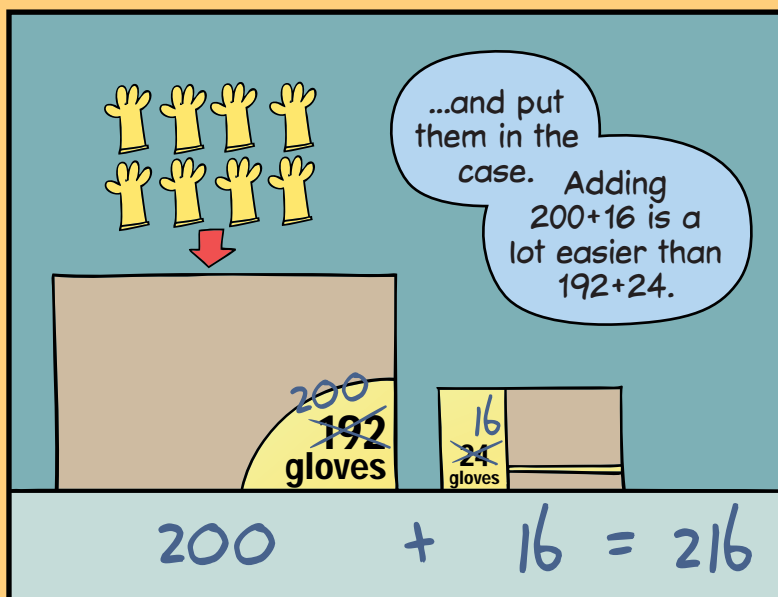
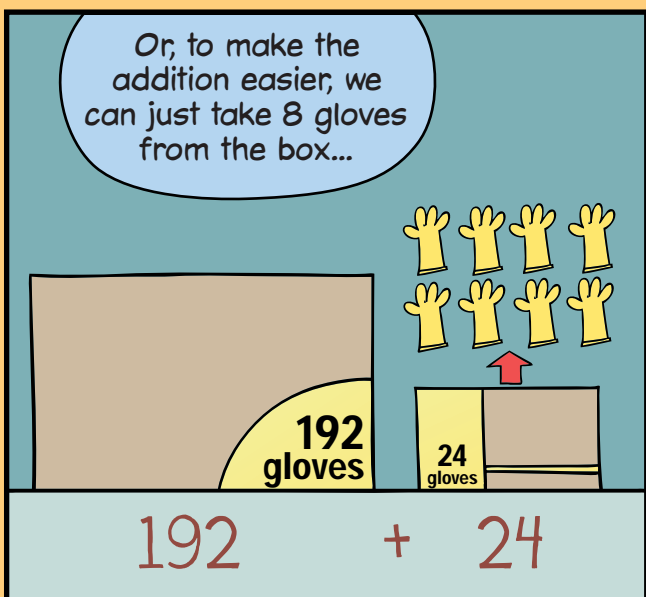
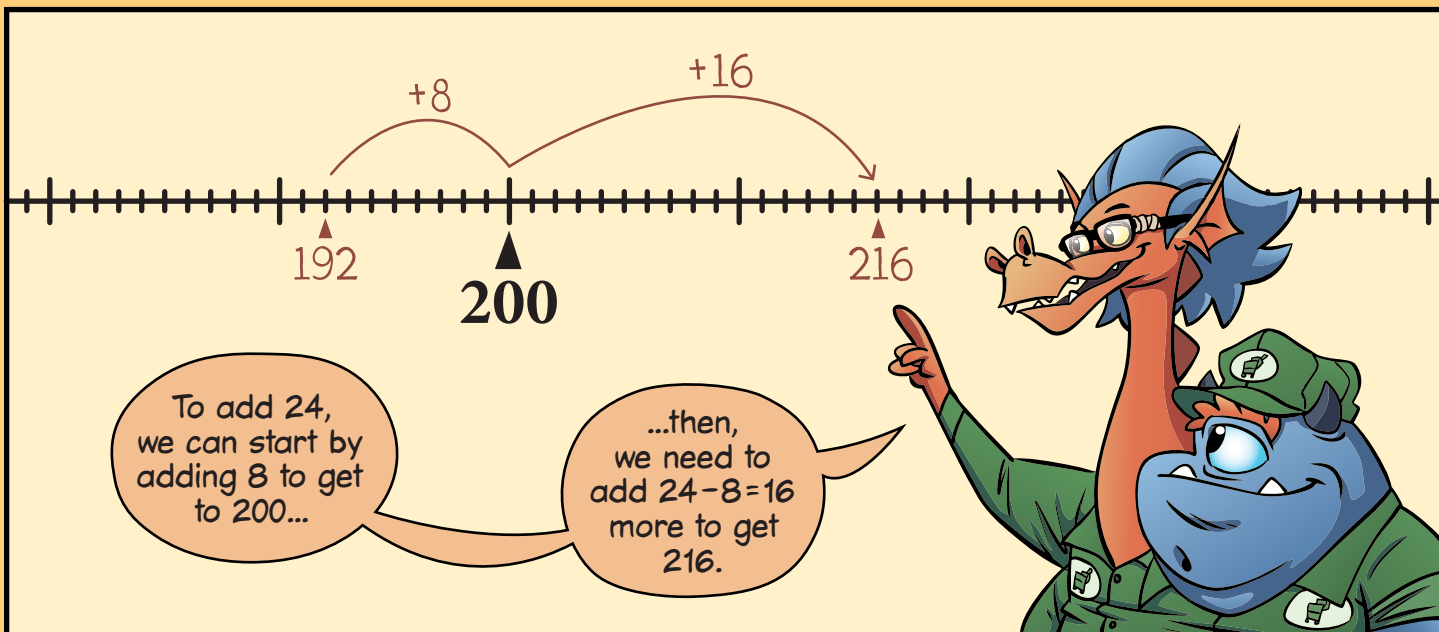
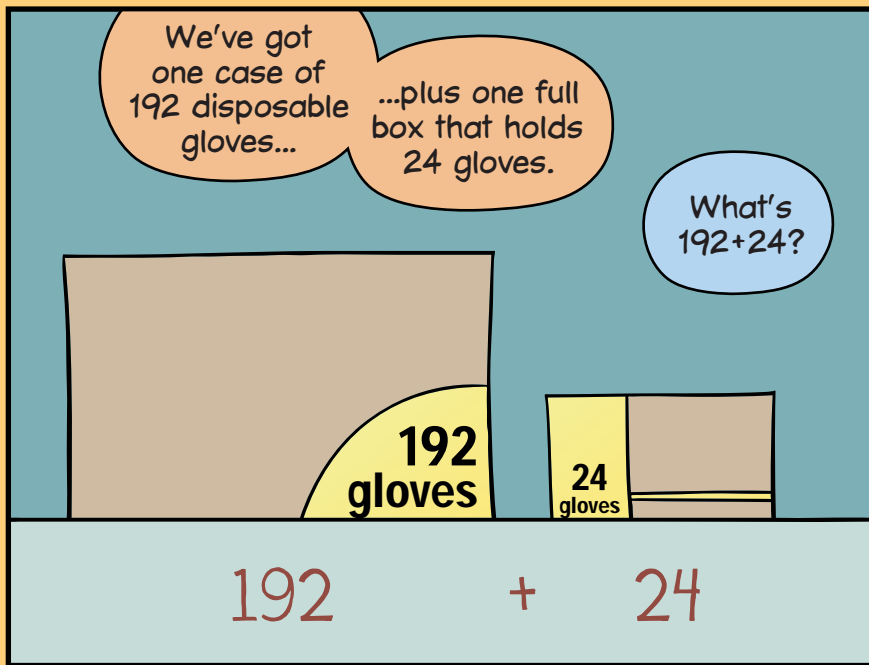
I just took two rolls from the pile...

48 + 26

...and put them in the box.

Moving the rolls doesn't change how many there are, but it sure makes the addition easier.

50 + 24



I'll do the sponges. To add 36 sponges plus 17 sponges...

$36 + 17$

...I can take 4 of these loose sponges and put them with the pack.

That gives me $40 + 13 = 53$.

$40 + 13 = 53$

Right. Or, you could take 3 sponges from the pack and put them with the loose sponges.

Then, you have $33 + 20 = 53$.

$33 + 20 = 53$

Either way, the addition is easier.

And the number of sponges doesn't change.

Let's count the fizzing mop bucket tablets.

We have two full packs.

There are 75 tabs in this ultra pack, and 128 tabs in this mega pack.

$75 + 128$
